I would like to bring the following to your attention in this October newsletter:

## Parent Teacher Meetings:

## School Planning and School Self Evaluation (SSE):

# Active Schools Programme:

As part of our Active School's Programme and our Active Flag, we have organised 'walking and talking' before school starts each morning. The children are enjoying this wellbeing and exercise activity in a safe environment. Thanks to Mr. Eustace and the staff for coordinating this enjoyable healthy activity each morning. During this year we will be reapplying to renew our Active School School Flag.

### **Donations of Toys and Books:**

Whenever families are doing a clear out of books or toys we would welcome donations of intact and undamaged toys and suitable complete jigsaws. - <u>Gaelic Football:</u> Our Boys and Girls football team have training on Mondays and Thursdays after school. They are taking part in the Cumann na mBunscol Football blitzes this term and we wish them well in these cometitions. Thanks to Ms. Cullinan and Mr. Eustace for training our footballers.
- <u>Hurling and Camogie Blitz</u>: Our girls and boys in 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> class recently took part in the St. Flannan's College hurling and camogie blitz with 15 local primary schools taking part.
